STEM: Olympic Torch in a Bottle

Learning Intention: We can observe how the properties of liquids and gases behave in different ways.

Success Criteria:

- I can observe that gases have mass and take up space.
- 2. I can recognise that substances exist in different states.



*Please dispose of oil safely and responsibly.

Method:

- 1. Fill the bottle or jar a quarter full with water.
- 2. Fill almost to the top with vegetable oil.
- They should separate into two layers, water at the bottom and oil sitting on top.
- 4. Add about 6-8 drops of food colouring once the oil and water separate.
- 5. The colour will mix with the water at the bottom.
- Put in half of an effervescent tablet and watch the bubbles form. Add more effervescent tablets bit by bit to keep the bubbles rising and falling.
