# Exploring the Inside of an Apple

## Materials for Apple Science

- **A variety of apples or one apple**
- **Knife**
- **Crayons or markers**
- **Scissors**
- **Apple cut out booklet (provided in pack)**

## Directions for Apple Science

1. Place an assortment of apples out for children to explore. Talk about how the apples feel and look.
2. Colour the front of the apple page to look like their favourite kind of apple!
3. Fold the sheet in half along the dotted line.
4. Cut out the apple shape, **being sure to leave a small segment of the folded edge intact** so the apples don't come apart.
5. Now you have an apple booklet!
6. Make a prediction about what you will find inside the apples once they are cut in half.
7. Have an adult cut the apple in half and observe what's inside. (You will find the core, seed chambers, and seeds.)
8. Record observations inside their apple booklet.
9. Write a few sentences describing what you see.

### Activity 3 – PE Activity Using different throws

How can we solve problems when moving?

What you will need:

- Help from a parent
- A soft object to throw (for example, soft ball, pair of socks, soft toy, scrunched-up paper)
- An object or landmark to create a target for the object to hit (for example, bucket, a long piece of string laid in a circle, an 'X' formed by two pieces of tape/material, a t-shirt laid on the ground, a chair/bench, a wall, a tree)

You will:

- trial a number of techniques when throwing an object towards a target
- describe your body position when performing different throws.

#### Activity – Throwing with a Step or no step!

- Create a target that you can safely throw a soft object towards. Choose a 'starting point' where you will throw the object from.

- Throw the object towards the target. You should aim to hit the target. Pick up the object from where it landed and throw the object again until the target has been hit.
- Repeat the challenge 5 times for each type of throw attempting to hit the target in a fewer number of throws.

### Mother and Joey Kangaroo Puppet Instructions

1. Cut the cereal packet/box until you have a diorama set up. So, you'll need three sides and one bottom.

2. Glue the printable onto the rectangular side of the cereal packet you cut off.



3. Once the glue is dry, cut out the kangaroos and surrounding terrain. Cut along the line of the mother kangaroo's pouch too. You can slip the joey in and out of the mother's pouch during play.


4. Fold over the flaps on the bottom of each item. These should allow the figures to stand up, but you can use a little bit of blue tack or sticky tape to make it more secure.
