Batik Drawing

You will need:

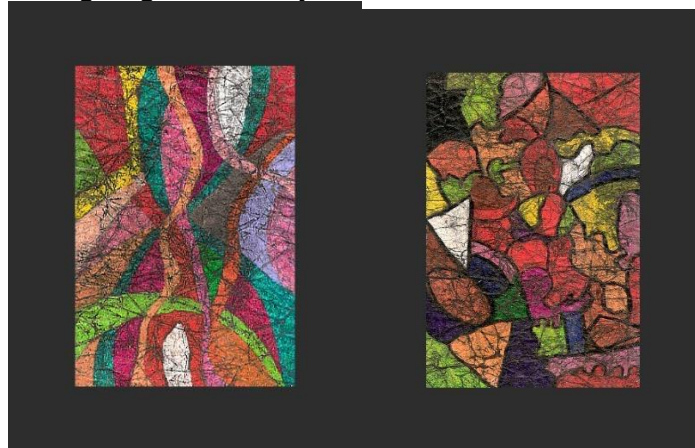
Paper

Oil Pastels

Black Acrylic Paint

Batik is an ancient art of creating pattern on fabric or paper. It is very popular in Indonesia.

You are going to create your own batik abstract drawing.



Begin by drawing a design on a white piece of paper using oil pastels. Make sure you use your muscles to press hard, so your paper is very well covered. When you have finished covering the entire page, scrunch your paper up. I know this sounds strange, but you need the creases in your paper to create the effect.



Flatten out your paper and using watered down black paint, paint over your image.



Once it is dry you can use black oil pastel to outline the shapes or leave it as it is. You might like to glue it onto a black background as above.

Activity 3 - PE Activity - Kicking goals, Step or no step
How can we solve problems when moving?

In previous lessons you have performed and compared different types of throws.
Discuss the following reflective questions before beginning:

- What types of throws have you used in previous weeks?
- Can you identify any parts of the throw that may also help you when you kick?

You will need:

- Help from an adult.
- A safe playing area where you can kick a ball or soft object. Create a large goal that you can safely kick a ball/object towards.
- Create a smaller goal in the centre of the large goal. This will provide you with an opportunity to refine your kicking.

Step or no step examples

 <p>Two yellow cones form the small goal. Two green bins form the large goal.</p>	 <p>Two yellow racquets form the small goal. Two blue buckets form the large goal.</p>

Your challenge is to compare two different ways to kick your ball/object. The two ways are:

- Stand and kick
- Step forward and kick

Kick the ball/object towards the goal. You should aim to score a goal by kicking the ball/object through the small goal.

Repeat the challenge 5 times for each type of kick attempting to score a goal by kicking the ball/object through the goal.
